

# 10. Recreation - History and Libraries

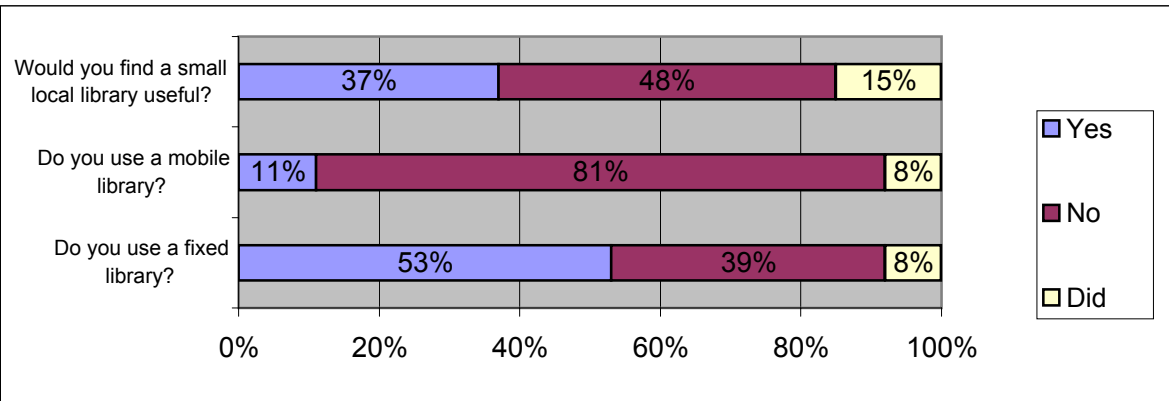
Undoubtedly the Parish is rich in history and it is interesting to note from the education section of the survey that local history talks/courses were one of the most popular suggestions.
